Here are 5 Reasons YOU should read every single day for 15 to 20 minutes.

- Reading Improves Brain Function: A person who reads everyday gets better at it over time. Not surprisingly, daily readers also gain more enjoyment from it than those that read less often. It can even improve memory and critical thinking skills. And activities like reading have been linked to a lower risk of Alzheimer's disease.(Alls)
- 2. **Reading Reduces Stress:** Modern life is stressful period. Reading may reduce stress more than walking, listening to music or playing games. When people read a really engrossing book it actively engages their imagination, which in turn distracts from daily stresses (at least for a little while).
- 3. **Reading Can Improve Your State of Mind:** People who are well read tend to be more empathetic and have higher self-esteem. When we read about other people it introduces the idea that people are human. We're all different, we have flaws, things are not always perfect and that's okay.
- 4. **Reading Improves Overall Wellness:** Spending 30 minutes a day reading a good book does a body good (and burns calories who knew?). People who read daily may live longer. And reading before bed can help improve sleep. Just try not to stay up all night reading unless you have zero obligations the next day.
- 5. Reading Aloud to Children Has a Lasting Impact: Reading aloud to children from day one is incredibly important. And making it part of the daily routine helps children to cultivate good reading habits and a love of reading. It can have a lasting impact on a child's life. These children tend to have higher vocabularies and often become frequent readers themselves.

#### **VOTING PROCESS FOR DEARS**

are unable to adequately access technology. These Sorors will receive letters

via US mail (mailed by April 13, 2021), informing them about the Election process, time and date. An Elections slate including names, positions desired, and a photo will be sent with the letters. Soror Robin Worthy's Leach contact /cell number as Chair of Nominating Committee will be sent so that she may answer any questions. In addition, they will receive information about participating in the Mock Election from April 15th - 22nd.

# **ELECTION NIGHT/CHAPTER MEETING At the May Meeting (on Election Night):**

- Pictures of each candidate, and the position they are running for will be shown on the screen (document will be the same as the election slate that is mailed to the Delta Dears). An Elections Committee member will read the candidate's name and position that they are running for.
- An Elections Committee member will quickly review the procedures for voting using Election Runner (same information that will be mailed/emailed).

#### How to vote:

- 1. To vote at the May Chapter meeting on Election Runner, Sorors MUST have their first and last names displayed and their camera on.
- 2. An Election Committee member will launch the Election Runner ballot which will send an email to each Soror present at the meeting (Again, to be sent a ballot/vote, your camera must be on with your first and last names displayed).
- 3. In case of a tie, Sorors (including Dears) will follow the same voting procedure, i.e., re-launching the Election Runner software for members to vote again only on the position(s) for which there is a tie.
- 4. At the end of the voting process, Elections Committee members (Faye, Adrienne and Myself) will enter a Zoom breakout room to obtain & process the results.
- 5. The Chair of Elections will announce the Sorors who got the majority vote and the Chair announces the winner.

6. The Chair will ask for a motion to accept the results of the Election Committee. Members/Sorors will vote to accept the motion.

#### Social Action- Soror Williams

- The Social Action Committee requests the Gastonia Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta, Incorporated to participate in volunteering with the Gaston County BackPack Weekend Food Program. This program feeds children on the weekends during the school year from September through April. Initially, the Social Action Committee suggests our Chapter volunteer in the two months of October 2021 and April 2022 at the warehouse of the Program to receive the monthly foods, pull food orders and distribute to Program Partners who will deliver the foods to the various schools.
- This program feeds approximately 900 students a year who otherwise may not have enough food at home to eat during the weekends. Ensuring that children are eating healthy on the weekends during the school year enables them to be better prepared for learning on Monday mornings. The Social Action Committee will also explore Sponsoring A Child with the BackPack Weekend Program which consists of directing a donation of \$350 to help feed a child or children for an entire school year.
